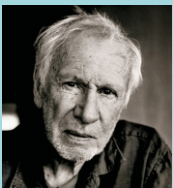

Born in 1939 in Besançon, France, Jean-François Laguionie developed a passion for drawing from an early age. After studying at the Arts Appliqués, he met Paul Grimault, who introduced him to animation and whose studio he shared for almost ten years. It was there that he conceived his first short films. Each time, they met with success at festivals, including the Palme d'Or for Short Films at the Cannes Film Festival for *Rowing Across the Atlantic*. In 1999, he directed *The Castle of the Apes*, a much more ambitious and mainstream film than the previous one. He went on to collaborate with Blue Spirit Productions and JPL films on his subsequent feature films.

The director's social conscience is most vividly revealed in his film *Minsk*, which exposes the terror regime in Belarus. The film won the FIPRESCI Prize at the Film Festival Cottbus.

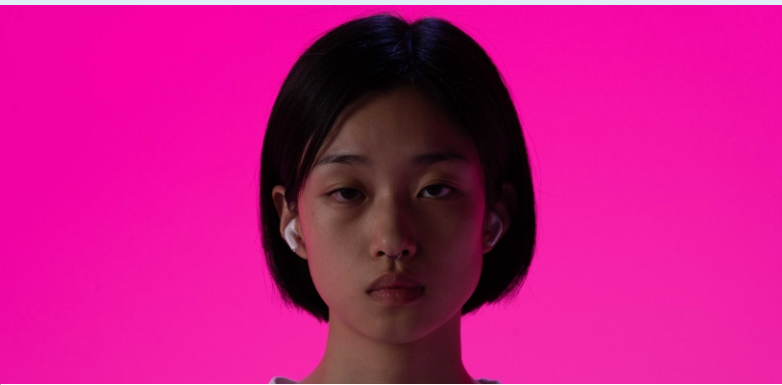

Many of them had their world premieres at major festivals like Cannes, Venice and Sundance. Dupieux' films are often unique, skewing away from narrative conventions, with a great taste for the absurd and a dark sense of humour.

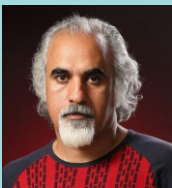

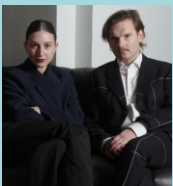

## Synopsis:

In a small Hungarian town, Ana Bauch is a dedicated and liberal-minded literature teacher within the public system. Beloved by her students for her unorthodox and creative approach, she assigns Agnieszka Holland's 1995 *Total Eclipse*, depicting the relationship between 19th-century French poets Arthur Rimbaud and Paul Verlaine, so they can better understand Rimbaud's poetry. When a conservative father interrupts his son Victor during the screening and hears of the assignment, he reports Ana to the school's principal. Ana is accused of misconduct and spreading homosexual propaganda, and when the local media get wind of the brewing scandal, she faces even more scrutiny. In a system within which many have given up, Ana must decide to fight or to flee — perhaps to a restaurant job abroad.

At the Sapientia Hungarian University of Transylvanian in Cluj-Napoca, Romania she finished her BA degree in Film-Photo-Media studies in 2013. She continued her studies in Hungary at the Budapest Metropolitan University, where she earned her MA degree in Television and Film Directing. ## Synopsis:

Xoftex is a Greek refugee camp, where Syrian and Palestinian asylum seekers anxiously wait for news of their refugee status. To pass the time between interviews with the immigration office, Nasser and his friends film satirical sketches and make preparations for a zombie horror flick. Except that the reality of the camp could be taken for a horror scenario itself. The tension between its inhabitants gains momentum and every conflict removes one more brick from the wall which divides reality from dream – or, indeed, nightmare. Fragments of real life, humour, and the unimaginable suffering of people risking their lives to escape their own country, merge into an explosive, at times, surreal spectacle which invites the viewers to immerse themselves in the story and the lives of immigrants in a way they will never have experienced before.
