Synopsis:

Anand, a voluntarily retired teacher, has initiated a movement to screen films for school children in remote villages. Recognizing the power of cinema as an educational tool, he continues to promote film literacy despite facing public opposition. For the past 10 years, Anand and his Children's Film Club have been running an innovative initiative to teach children through cinema. His work catches the attention of a young filmmaker named Omkar, who decides to document Anand's efforts, As Omkar films the process. Anand's struggle to bring quality cinema to children is revealed. During one screening in a remote village, the power goes out midway through the film. leaving the children to watch only half. It's here that Anand meets Ankur, a talkative, mischievous, and intelligent 9-vear-old boy. While conversing with Anand, Ankur recounts the story of the incomplete film, which leads the narrative to take an unexpected turn. The journey, which began with Anand's love for cinema, eventually unfolds into an adventurous connection between two distant worlds, bridging the gap between cultures and stories from Hollywood to the village.

Giran

Synopsis:

In the Mang community, the day after a Giran (eclipse) concludes with a unique tradition. A newlywed girl bathes at sunrise, visits a prominent villager's house, and donates as part of a ritual. Villagers, in turn, give her stale food and clothes, believing that such donations transfer their crises to the Mang society, ensuring the village's well-being.

This practice is depicted in the story of Guna, an eight-year-old girl raised by her uncle after losing her parents. Married into the household of Babu Manga, her husband, Santaya, is an addict. Superstition dominates the village; illnesses are treated with rituals instead of medical care. Guna manages the household out of fear of her husband.

When her mother-in-law falls ill, Guna recalls her late mother's promise and resolves to end harmful customs. She secretly removes the ritual items from her home and discards them in water, symbolically breaking the cycle of superstition.

The film highlights the struggles of the Mang community, emphasizing the need to preserve culture while rejecting superstitions.

Vijay Srirang Khude was born in Niravagaj, a village in Baramati taluka, Pune district, Maharashtra. He completed his schooling up to class 10 in his village. His interest in storytelling began in school, directing a play, Sasu Varchad Jawai, which reached the district competition while he was in class 4. In 2008, he co-directed the film Koyta. In 2017, his short film, Freedom won awards for Best Short Film, Best Actress, and Best Actor at festivals in Kolhapur, Phaltan, Pune, and Aurangabad. He followed this with the short film Black Game, which also won multiple awards. He later directed a web movie, Walit, now available on YouTube. In 2023, he wrote a story based on his childhood and decided to produce and direct Giran independently.

Synopsis:

The film portrays the undocumented lives of the Pardhi community, a marginalized tribe in Maharashtra labeled as "born criminals" during the colonial era. Despite 75 years of Indian independence, their socio-economic conditions remain unchanged. The Pardhi are a nomadic tribe deprived of land, housing, education, and stable professions, often linked to theft and robbery.

The story follows a teenage girl determined to become a teacher despite facing personal, familial, social, and cultural challenges. Her journey highlights the systemic barriers faced by the Pardhi community. The film delves into issues such as their struggle to prove Indian citizenship, lack of education, and societal neglect.

It also examines broader societal dynamics, including caste discrimination in schools, exploitation of farm laborers by landlords, and the politics of dominance in rural settings. Through these layers, the film critiques the indifference of governance toward marginalized groups while presenting a chain of events that offer hope for transformation within the Pardhi community.

Synopsis:

In the beautiful village of Kokan, India, Bablya resides with his parents Digya and Nanda. Despite their pleas, Bablya is determined to join a Dashavtaar theater group traveling to Russia, convinced it offers a better life. This choice strains his relationship with Digya. In Russia, Bablya builds a life, falling in love with an Indian-Russian woman. They have a beautiful daughter and work at a pub until tragedy strikes—an altercation leads to their untimely deaths, leaving their daughter, Pari, orphaned. Upon hearing the news, Digya and Nanda rush to Russia, discovering Pari in a foster home, Hindered by regulations, they fight to bring Pari back to Kokan, India. Amidst memories of Bablya's happy home, they arrange his last rites with the help of Chandu, Bablya's friend. Permission granted, they bond with Pari, but their attempts to integrate her into Kokan fail, The school principal advises that Pari belongs where she can flourish. Despite resistance, Nanda realizes Pari's rightful place is in Russia, where she ultimately returns her, acknowledging that Pari can only thrive where she truly belongs.
